We are spearheading a statewide task force helping to establish a sex offender management system that will one day be a model for the nation.

Advocacy Services

A sexual assault case in Burrillville was the first to be successfully prosecuted under the Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) — a new partnership among police, prosecutors and the SATRC staff to ensure that victims receive the support and compassion they need to help bring offenders to justice.

IN 2002 ►

2,490 individuals received services — a 33 percent increase in the last year.

2,196 individuals, including police and hospital personnel and Helpline advocates, received training.

47 new advocates graduated from our training program.

1,128 volunteer hours were provided to **256** victims receiving advocacy and support at hospitals and police stations.

53 victims received SART services.

Our Adult Advocacy Program provides around-the-clock services to victims of sexual assault, sexual harassment, domestic violence, hate crimes and other acts of violence — and their families and friends. Our trained advocates accompany victims to hospital emergency rooms, police departments and courts to provide information, emotional support and referrals.

Rhode Island Children's Advocacy Center

The Rhode Island Children's Advocacy Center is a refuge for children who have been sexually abused or suffered from other acts of violence.

Our multidisciplinary team comprising prosecutors, police, the Department of Children, Youth and Families, medical and mental health professionals and human service providers, conducts the interviews in safe and nurturing environments. In the past few years, CAC has expanded its base to provide services for adults with developmental disabilities and established a non-offending parenting group.

IN 2002 ►

260 victims and their non-offending caretakers accessed services.

279 professionals received training on the multidisciplinary approach to case management.

38 Rhode Island Police Departments have signed interagency agreements.

98 cases were recommended for prosecution.

186 children were interviewed.

150 cases were tracked through the criminal justice system.

Clinical Services

IN 2002 ►

1,057 individuals received services through the clinical program.

104 adults and **103** children received individual or group counseling.

93 clients participated in the Building Bridges Program and the Rural Outreach Project.

73 individuals received services through the Homicide Bereavement Program.

342 individuals participated in the prison program — psychoeducational groups for incarcerated adult survivors.

A Clergy Abuse Survivors Group was formed.

36,638 calls were logged from the VINE system.

316 individuals and **66** social service agencies received services, and or information through The Office of Victim Services, in partnership with the Rhode Island Department of Corrections.



REACHING OUT TO THE HISPANIC/LATINO COMMUNITY: New staff and support programs were added to better serve and reach out to the Hispanic/Latino community.

Our clinical services provide the support and tools victims need to recover from the trauma of sexual violence.

Through a variety of treatment programs including individual and group therapy, sexual abuse evaluations, homicide bereavement programs for children and adults, consultations and a unique victim information and notification system (1-877-RI-VINE), SATRC's compassionate and qualified staff are meeting the needs of thousands of individuals statewide.

Policy – changing the system

For nearly thirty years, SATRC has been the leader in the area of effecting change when it comes to the issue of sexual assault. By providing the appropriate expertise and vision, we serve as a resource for policy makers working to change society's response to sexual violence. According to national statistics, every two minutes somewhere in America, someone is sexually assaulted. We recognize the need to educate the public to help shape public policy and better protect victims/survivors. In 1987, we successfully guided passage of the Marital Rape Law making it a crime to sexually assault one's spouse. This year, we facilitated the revision of Rhode Island's version of Megan's law to enhance public safety by strengthening the system that manages convicted sex offenders who will one day live in the community at large. As the sole agency in the state whose mission is to deal with and address the issues of sexual assault as a community concern, we understand the importance of collaborating with other agencies and governmental leaders to work towards ending sexual violence.



SETTING POLICY AND ADVOCATING FOR VICTIMS: SATRC convened a special task force to tackle flaws in Rhode Island's version of Megan's Law and submitted new legislation to better protect the public from the most dangerous sexual offenders.

Education/Prevention Services

IN 2002 ►
4,518 individuals participated in education and training programs; of those **2,986** were young people between the ages of 3 and 18. The remaining **1,532** were adults who participated in training workshops.

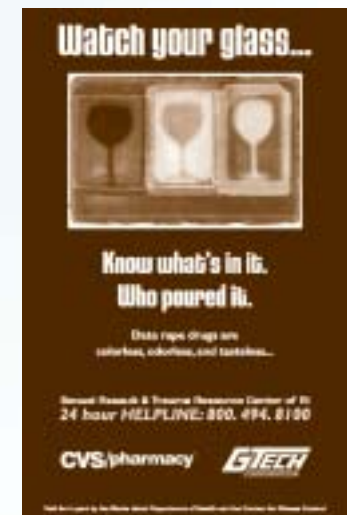

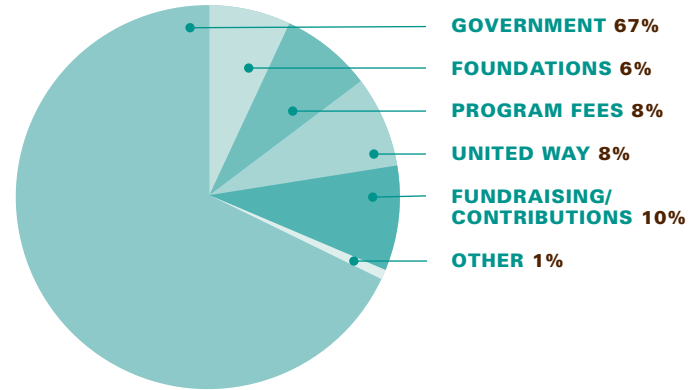

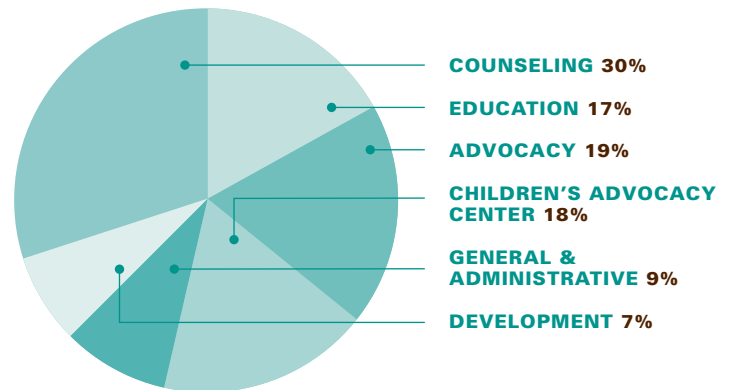
